Identifying Challenges

It's important to understand the challenges and opportunities you're looking to tackle ahead of generating ideas for improving services or creating savings - are your ideas going to tackle systemic issues or just the symptoms of them? What makes a great challenge and how does solving your challenge support your strategic objectives?

This workshop, led by Nesta's Challenge Prize team and Y Lab, will provide advice on what makes a good challenge and some practical hands on support and tools to help you develop your own challenge.

How to generate savings

There are numerous ways that public sector organisations can generate savings. Some are relatively simple - cutting services or trimming spend where possible. Others are more complex and require different types of thinking - passing responsibility for service delivery to the public or making spend more visible to allow for better public scrutiny being two examples.

In this practical session, Geoff Mulgan, Chief Executive, Nesta, will introduce the 12 Economies Framework - a tool that can help public and third sector organisations identify new ways to generate savings and to think differently about how they deliver their services.

As well as direct savings, we'll look at how savings are accrued across stakeholders and the differences between cashable and non-cashable savings.

Teams and Collaboration

As important to the success of a project as a good idea is a strong, capable team. In this workshop, led by Nesta's Skills team, you'll learn how to build an innovation team, to map project stakeholders and ensure that the right people with the right skills and responsibilities are involved in your project from day one.

A practical one day event that will introduce participants to tools and techniques that will:

- Enable them to start working as a team;
- Introduce them to stakeholder mapping tools and techniques;
- Build a picture of what they currently do and how it links to other organisations;
- Provide an opportunity for reflection and peer-to-peer feedback.

What makes a good R&D project?
